





"Dear Abdullah," advised Muhammad, "whenever you plan to do something, you should always say 'Insha Allah'."





Your teacher will help you make a spinner like the one on the next page.


Instructions:

Who should say the word the arrow lands on? the person who sneezed or the friends?



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



'I want Muhammad!' the man shouted rudely. So Rasulullāh (s) said, 'I am Muhammad....'



proof like all the other prophets of Allah. If you are a Nabi, then show me your proof!!'


So Rasulullāh (s) said to the Bedouin, 'If a part of me shows you the proof, will you believe it?' The Bedouin laughed and

'How is that, little boy?!' the Bedouin asked in surprise.








storm and your fear of dying disappeared and you were very happy.'

The Bedouin then became a good Muslim and a follower of Rasulullāh (s) and went back to his people and told them his story and soon all of them became Muslims too


Moral of the Story:


